Adventure Little Kids (Gr. PreK-1st)

This is where kids will learn essential skills like using markers, scissors, glue and paint used for older classes. Class fee(10 wks) = \$30

Geography- Africa (Gr. K-2nd)

We will study the countries, land, people, animals and customs of the continent of Africa. Please check with me prior to signing your child up for this class if they fall outside of the age group listed (ages 5-8). Cost (10wks)- \$35

Making Math Memorable (Gr. 1st-2nd)

Math can actually be FUN! This class will focus on making math memorable and fun through a variety of engaging hands-on activities which will include manipulatives, STEM projects, learning games, and math-centered literature. Support will be given for the memorization of basic addition/ subtraction facts. Number sense, critical thinking, and core math concepts for this level will be reinforced, math will be related to real life, and most of all, much FUN will be had!

Tuition(10 wks): \$35 + \$15 materials fee

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Elementary Chorus (Gr. 1st-6th)

This session will build on the repertoire, singing games, and concepts covered in the spring class. We will sing songs based on scripture, songs for learning/memorizing facts, and songs just for fun. In addition to standing up front and singing, we mix it up with lots of games and movement activities to help practice keeping the steady beat, explore our voices, and have fun together! **Cost(10 wks): \$40**

Chocolate Fever Language Arts (Gr. 2nd-4th)

This class will use the novel <u>Chocolate Fever</u> to develop language arts skills through class discussions, comprehension activities, and vocabulary. Completing graphic organizers through written work and illustrations, as well as other writing prompts and activities that relate to the book will also be a part of the class. Books will be provided for students to use. **Class Fee(10 wks): \$25**

Apologia Science- Botany (Gr. 3rd-5th)

We will study Apologia's Botany curriculum this year. Students will explore the life cycle of seeds to plants, how plants reproduce and make their food, as well as how to identify and classify a variety of plants. Class fee(10 wks) = \$30 + \$5.00 supplies

PA History (Gr. 5th-adult)

Content will meet PA History state requirements. Teaching will focus on the Pennsylvania State Capital, William Penn's History, PA Folk Art, Philadelphia Architecture, and Chester & Lancaster County local art themes. Additional content will be investigated while building on themes introduced in the first level class. More examination of the importance of both the role of the battle at Gettysburg and the hardships of Valley Forge. Our studies will continue to be "hands-on."

Class cost (10 wks)= \$65/ 10 week term + \$25 Materials + Student Purchased materials (3 inch 3 Ring Binder, Page Protectors, Sketchbook, 12 or more colored pencils, #2 Pencils, miscellaneous as needed) = \$90

Immersion Spanish (Gr. 6-8)

I will be using a combination of songs & rhymes, picture vignettes with accompanying stories, Gouin's 'series', skits, literature, and grammar study to teach language in a way that is incredibly robust and comprehensive. Book to used while in class will be En Mi Familia by Carmen Lomas Garza and Los Musicos del Pueblo de Bremen / The Bremen Town Musicians (Spanish and English Edition) by Brian Wildsmith. Cost(20 wks) = \$70

Writing the Research Paper (Gr. 7-9)

This course will guide students through the process of writing book report/critiques as well as a formal research paper. The first two weeks will be devoted to book report/critiques. The last eight weeks will cover a step-by-step process to writing a research paper.

Class Cost(10 wks) = \$45

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Painting With Acrylics (Gr. 7th-12th)

Learn to use acrylic paint descriptively and expressively in this hands-on studio class. We will learn to paint by painting through a series of structured assignments and challenges designed to teach a variety of painting techniques while learning some color theory and the elements and terminology of visual art on the way. The class will be structured into three ten week modules which can be taken singly as a 10 week (fall only) class, or built into a 30 week (all year) or 20 week (fall and spring only) option. Note that the fall class is a prerequisite for the winter term and spring modules. Winter term will include a canvas stretching and priming project, Spring term will include a plein air painting excursion opportunity. Comfort with drawing from life is a plus. Cost: \$100 + \$90 for supplies for 30 week class. \$35 + \$30 for supplies per 10 week class

German 1 (Gr. 7th-adult)

This is a beginner-level German course for high school students. We will be working on the four areas of language learning; reading, writing, listening, and speaking. We will spend class time going over grammar, vocabulary, and some German culture and history.

Class Cost(30 wks): \$185 + \$20 supplies = \$205 total

Meteorology (Gr. 8th-12th)

You'll learn the difference between climate & weather, what air masses, fronts, high & low pressure areas are, what the jet stream is, cloud type identification, and how all of these combine to create our weather. We will focus on the formation & path of storms and the weather that attends them. You'll begin to learn how to forecast and there will be a forecasting competition. *Class cost*(30 wks) = \$150

Worldviews: Through the Lens of Scripture (Gr. 9th-12th)

Worldview class will address several worldviews such as Islam, Buddhism, Animism, Humanism

and related *isms* i.e., Marxism and Progressivism. As we focus on the content of the worldview, we will investigate the <u>origin</u> of the worldview, the <u>lives of chief proponents</u>, the <u>key tenets and key documents</u>, and <u>contrast the claims with Scripture</u>. Bibles are the only required text.

Pre-requisite: Algebra I. Please note this is a high school Geometry class that uses Algebra I skills. This course is taught based on MathUSee Geometry. The MathUSee Geometry Student pack is needed for class. The text book & DVD are optional. Please purchase the Student Pack prior to the first class, as we will begin using it that day. Students will also need a protractor and a compass. Class cost(30 wks) = \$170

Munchkin Gym (Gr. PreK-K)

We will play games and do exercises that promote growth in both fine and large motor skills. Students will be expected to follow instruction as we are introduced to different sports and activities. *Class cost*(10 wks): \$35

Fundamentals of Music (Gr. K-2nd)

The early elementary years are crucial for laying a musical foundation. This 10-week session will focus on developing students' steady beat and vocal awareness through chants/rhymes, songs, singing games, and folk dancing. Students will learn to read basic rhythmic notation (quarter/eighth notes and quarter rests), perform them using body percussion, and create their own rhythmic compositions.

Life Draw I (Gr. 4th-12th)

This course will guide students through the process of writing a critique as well as a formal research paper. Lessons will include a step-by-step process to writing a research paper in MLA format. This class will also prepare students to write papers at the college level for those who plan to go on to further education. Class Cost(10 wks) = \$45

Pre-engineering Electronics (Gr. 10th-12th)

Pre-Engineering Electricity is a prerequisite for this course with the exception of seniors who are taking or have taken Chemistry or Physics. Students will learn how diodes and transistors work and how they function in power supplies, amplifiers, op amps, flip flops, 555 timers, logic gates and project circuits like Tesla Coils, strobe lights, clap switches, subwoofer and phone booster amps, bi-amped audio power amplifiers and preamps. Students may build a wide variety of projects though project work is not required. *Class cost*(30 wks)= \$150

Beginner Language Arts(Gr. Pre-K-1st)
This class will use children's literature to identify story elements such as character, setting, plot, etc. Students will then respond to the story by completing a simple writing prompt. Games and activities practicing letter sound identification, decoding and blending simple words, and sight words will also included in the class. Class cost(10 wks) = \$25

Elementary Gym (Gr. K-5th) An active gym class featuring large group games that provide a good cardio workout. (\$10 discount for each additional sibling) Class fee(10 wks) = \$30

7 C's of History (Gr. 2nd-6th)

Creation-Corruption-Catastrophe-Confusion-Chr ist-Cross-Consummation. This biblical teaching will enhance the understanding of the path of history from a biblical worldview. Loving Lit Through Lapbooks (Gr. 3rd-5th) We will read the classic children's novel, Charlotte's Web, each week completing a creative hands-on activity or two that corresponds to the book. Many of these pieces will be compiled into a lapbook, which will be a special keepsake documenting the students' learning and serving

as a memento of our novel study. Reading comprehension, vocabulary, writing skills, and character analysis will all be incorporated into our time together. Please purchase a copy of Charlotte's Web and bring to the first class.

Tuition(10 wks): \$35 + \$15 materials fee

Elementary Art (Gr. 4th-6th) We will create a diverse assortment of art and craft projects using a variety of materials. Class Fee(10 wks) = \$35 + \$10 supplies

Board Game Theory (Gr. 5th-12th) Students will learn about at least 10 of the most commonly used mechanics in board games. Being able to correctly identify what mechanics are being employed by different board games will increase your ability to understand how the game plays, play effectively, and learn other games that use similar mechanics with ease. After learning about the mechanic we will play a game that heavily features the mechanic that we learned about. (There will be a weekly YouTube video to watch with instructions on how to play the coming week's game, so we can spend more time discussing the mechanic and how it is shown in the game instead of going over the rules of how to play.) No food is allowed in this class. Class cost(10 wks) \$30

Life Draw III (Gr. 5th-12th) Continuing development of drawing skills with additional media options. Goal of minimum 2 finished pieces. Prerequisite: Life Draw 2 or teacher discretion. H&B pencils can be brought by the student or are available for purchase (usually \$5). Class fee(10 wks) = \$30

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Comic Illustration & the Art of Portraiture (Gr.6th-12th) This new studio class provides students with the basics of Comic Illustration and The Art of Portraiture. Students will gain an introduction to basic human proportions, anatomy, creative problem solving and illustration techniques. Assignments will form a basis to critically understand these art forms and the appreciation of a good sense of humor. Class Cost(30 wks): \$195 + \$70 materials + Student Purchased materials (3-inch 3 Ring Binder, Page Protectors, Sketchbook, 12 or more colored pencils, #2 Pencils, miscellaneous as needed) = \$265

Introduction to Zentangle (Gr. 7th-12th)

"Zentangle" is a structured drawing process combining elements of 2 dimensional design with traditional and innovative decorative drawing patterns (called "tangles.") Students will learn a new tangle (or a few new tangles) each week and have fun combining them into new designs. We will also explore integrating zentangle into other crafts such as card making or fiber arts. Cost(10 wks) \$35 + \$25 for supplies

Guitar/Ukelele for Worship(Secondary Students) (Gr. 7th-12th) This course is for students who have at least a very basic knowledge of how to play guitar or ukulele. As long as they can play a few chords, they may enroll in the class. I will provide instruction for chords they don't already know. We will cover strumming patterns, chord theory, and hopefully dabble in a bit of songwriting. We will use contemporary worship music (chord charts) to learn how to play in a band/worship team setting. Bass players are also welcome, although we really can't use more than 1 or 2. Bass and electric guitar players must bring an amplifier. Each week we will play several songs; students will be encouraged to practice at home. Students will also have the opportunity to play percussion instruments (djembe, cajon,

tambourine, egg shaker, etc.). Students will need to provide their own guitar (and amp if applicable) or ukulele and a 3-ring binder to hold their music. **Cost(10 wks): \$60**

CPR/First Aid (Gr. 7th-adult) American Heart Association heartsaver CPR and first aid certification course. Students will complete hands on CPR training and basic first aid skills. Upon successful completion of the class, students will receive the heartsaver CPR/first aid certification from AHA. Younger students must be able to perform a successful chest compression in order to become certified. Preference given to students but adults are welcome if class size permits. If you want to learn CPR and first aid skills but do not want a certification from AHA, you can join the class for a reduced fee. Class cost(10 wks)is \$50 which includes everything necessary for the class and certification. Without AHA certification the class cost is \$30.

Sewing (Gr. 7th-adult) Students will have the opportunity to learn basic sewing or how to make a small quilt. For the student who has no experience, they can start with a pillow case or a travel pillow, blanket set. Experienced students can make pajama pants or a skirt from recycled jeans. No experience needed if the student desires to make a quilt. Cost(10wks): \$30 plus materials. Sewing machine preferred.

Goal Setting For Life (Gr. 9th-12th) Come learn to make, set and achieve goals in your daily life! Learn the importance of writing down your plans, praying for your future, managing your time and following through with your goals to have a balanced life with growth and purpose. "Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established. .. The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps." Proverbs 16:3, 9 ESV Cost(10 wks):\$60

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Literature: Learning From the Ancient Texts (Gr.9th-12th) God chose to communicate to mankind using various literary genres. To begin our studies, we will investigate the genres that He has utilized to convey perfectly His eternal Word. Throughout the year we will compare and contrast God's eternal text with other texts that we read. From notable Greek philosophers, we will consider classic principles of wisdom and virtue and then conclude the year with the writings of Augustine in his well known work: Confessions. Government 101 (Gr. 9th-12th) This class will expand and enhance your knowledge of the constitution and our government in order to become an informed and involved citizen. We will learn through projects, activities, and videos, along with vibrant conversations. This 10 week class will fulfil a civics/ government half credit class. class fee(10 wks)-\$80

Apologia Biology Lab(Gr. 9th-12th) This lab class accompanies the Apologia "Exploring Creation with Biology" (3rd edition) curriculum, and includes the study of bacteria, protists, fungi, plants and animals. Class time will be used to complete all the laboratory exercises and reinforce the concepts of the text. Includes homework and quizzes. A course grade will be provided. Cost(30 wks): \$170 (textbook rental available for additional \$20)

Apologia Physics Lab (Gr. 11th-12th)

PREREQUISITE: Chemistry or special permission from instructor. This **two hour** lab class accompanies the Apologia Exploring Creation with Physics (2nd edition) curriculum. Class will be used to complete all the lab exercises, to

reinforce and supplement the concepts of the text and to review practice problems. Includes homework, quizzes and tests. A grade will be provided. **Cost(30 wks) = \$190 + \$20 book**

Coffee With Pastor Joel (Gr. 11th-12th) Pastor Saint shepherds the Independence Reformed Bible Church. Conversation will be allocated according to students interest/questions.

Burgess Bird Book Nature Study(Gr. PreK- 1st)

Students will discover the wonders of Birds through reading the Burgess Bird Book together, listening to bird sounds, coloring and other activities including Language Arts, Math, Art, and Music. Students are expected to be able to listen quietly and have attention span for art activities and interest in coloring. Please dress for art projects and time outside. Snacks such as pretzels, apples, cheese, crackers, etc will be served. Target age 5-6 year olds and well-behaved 4 year olds with ability to write letters. **Cost(10 wks) \$40**

Bible Safari (Gr. K-2nd) Travel through the Bible as we learn about a new animal each week and make a craft. **Class cost(10 wks): \$35**

States and Capitals (Gr. 2nd-3rd) Learning the names of states and capitals, enjoying puzzles, games, songs. We will learn fun facts about some of the states. Also learn where they are located on the United States. Cost (10 wks):\$35

Lego Creation Club (Gr. 3rd-5th) Get your creative juices flowing in this STEM related class! Each week we will have a themed challenge build after a short lesson based on that week's theme. LEGO builds will be disassembled at the end of each class. No LEGOS or LEGO builds will go home with students. cost(10 wks): \$40

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Music In the Middle Years (Gr. 3rd-5th) This course will increase students' appreciation for music and improve music literacy through singing, playing games, composition, dictation, movement/dancing, and playing boomwhackers and other instruments. I will introduce reading skills for both rhythm and pitch. The class will also be introduced to the music instrument families and will get to see dozens of instruments. Cost(10 wks) is \$50

Needle Felting 102 (Gr. 3rd-6th) Needlefelting 102 is a combined class with two projects to select from. It is next in the series of Needlefelting classes. Great opportunity for your student to develop deeper focus, eye hand coordination and creativity in constructing this project. This class will include teaching in not only production but assembly of multiple components. The science of felting will be discussed and studied again for reaffirmation. This course will include two projects (a pumpkin or for the advanced beginner, a feathered felted turkey). This way I am able to offer both projects. I will discuss after signup with the parent which project their student would like to learn to make. Materials and supplies needed will be provided in cost of class registration. Cost (10 wks): \$20 material fee due at time of registration. The balance of \$35 due on day of first class.

Making Math Memorable (Gr. 4th-6th) Math can actually be FUN! This class will focus on making math memorable and fun through a variety of engaging hands-on activities which will include manipulatives, STEM projects, learning games, and math-centered literature. Logic, critical thinking, and core math concepts for this level will be reinforced, math will be related to real life, and most of all, much FUN will be had! Tuition(10 wks): \$35 + \$15 materials fee

Create Your Own Board Game (Gr. 5th-12th)

Singularly, or in groups, students will create their own board game. The process will include: deciding on what mechanics they want to use, what the theme of their game will be, as well as creating the artwork. Students will aid in the creation of each others' games by play testing and giving feedback to help improve each game. We will use mock ups of the games during the play testing phase and create final products of the games by the end of the school year. If we have time we will also go through how to create a functional and well written rule book. Class cost(30 wks) is \$120 + \$50 for supplies

Money Marketing For Boys (Gr. 6th-9th) Learn to run your own business, economic concepts and investing. There will be a Money Market held in the Fellowship Hall for 4 weeks. Class cost (10 wks)= \$35

A Studio Introduction to Architecture & Interior Design (Gr. 6th-12th) This is a Studio class that explores structural analysis, the evolution of historic trends, and develops skills that will assist with rendering and designing original plans, including, but not limited to cutting foam board, using a metal straight edge, and teaching linear perspective. It is appropriate for the beginner and more advanced students. Class cost(30 wks): \$195 + \$70 materials + Student Purchased Materials (3 inch 3 Ring Binder, Page Protectors, Sketchbook, 12 or more colored pencils, #2 Pencils, miscellaneous as needed) = \$265

Crockpot, Casseroles, and Crumbles (Gr. 7th-12th) We will be working are way through some of my family favorits Crockpot and Casserole recipes and end the 10 weeks with some easy desserts. If time allows we will go over some healthy options for the recipes. Student will provide the meat portion for each recipe. Cost (10 wks): \$65

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Sewing (Gr. 7th-adult) case, Students will learn the basics of cutting material and sewing. Having your own sewing machine is preferred, but 2 sewing machines will be available for use in class. A variety of patterns/projects will be available to choose from. Students will buy their own material based on what project they make and fabric preferences. Project options include, but are not limited to: roll-up beach mat, bowl and plate cozies, coffee, cozy, pillow organizer for TV remotes, etc. Adults are also welcome. The cost (10 wks): \$30/person plus materials.

Basic Grammar and Writing (Gr. 9th-12th) The basics of the English language are necessary for fluent and well structured oral and written expression. As we address the basics of grammar (parts of speech, sentence structure, punctuation, etc.), we will apply what we are learning to our writing and speaking. Lots of whole group interaction! Students should buy the grammar text: Sadlier Grammar for Writing level 11 (green book) and bring a notebook or laptop for taking notes. Textbook: ISBN-10: 1421711214 Sadlier Grammar for Writing level 11 Class cost(30 wks) = \$199

History and Basics of Civil Law (Gr. 9th-12th)

Why do you have law? Isn't law, by it's very nature, coercive? Don't we wish to let people do whatever they want to do? Finally, isn't law restrictive? That is, doesn't law, by its very nature restrict the freedom of some for the benefit of others? Psalm 119 tells us that God's Law is a wonderful thing. Without it, we would lack wisdom, and without wisdom, knowledge becomes the problem, not the solution. In this class we will explore the history of law, but, more importantly, the basis of law, and why our Benevolent Creator blessed us with His Law, and the problems we would have without it. Cost(20 wks): \$20

Your Yearbook (Gr. 9th-12th) Students will be guided through the process of making a yearbook for the co-op. They will receive instruction and guidance in areas of planning, photography, writing, and graphic organization as they compile all the components to complete the project. Some activities may take place outside of the classroom/class hours, and students will be expected to take initiative to contribute and accomplish tasks. All co-op families will be able to individually go online to order/purchase their own copy of the yearbook through the online service utilized. Cost of class(30 wks) is \$100.

Algebra II (Gr. 10th-12th) Pre-requisite: Algebra I. This course is taught based on MathUSee Algebra II. The MathUSee Algebra II Student pack is needed for class. The text book & DVD are optional. Please purchase the student pack prior to the first class, as we will use it on that first day. Class cost(30 wks) = \$175
