Our Unique Partnership: It is important for students, parents, and tutors alike to realize that this is a unique partnership. All have come together for the common goal of home educating our children and preparing them for whatever God has created them to do. We meet once a week as a team to practice the classical arts within our community.

Tutor role

The tutor is a **lead learner** who provides weekly academic support in the classroom by facilitating and modeling techniques.

The tutor will arrive prepared and provide resources as needed. The tutor is also a source of support and encouragement to both parents and students.

Provide weekly lesson plans to the parents to oversee at home.

Provide initial instruction for lessons and/or discussions, activities, experiments and development of content.

Communicate with students and parents concerning performance.

Parent role

The parent is the **primary teacher**. S/he is fully responsible for the student's education. The parent will tailor the assignments as the student needs and will correct and assign grades to the student's work.

Administer their own legal homeschool.

Provide additional instruction as needed for their student to master material and/or concepts.

Provide accountability to complete assignments and help child be prepared so they can both get and give their best each week in community.

Communicate with tutors and program directors as needed to assist each student.

Student role

Students are to respect tutor, classmates, and the church in which we meet.

Come with a teachable spirit and a willingness to learn.

Work diligently at home and come prepared to discuss each seminar.

Bring all necessary supplies and completed assignments to class.

Seek out opportunities to encourage your classmates.

Ask questions in a respectful manner for the sake of clarity or curiosity.
