

Thoughts from the Editor's Kitchen Table

By the time this article is published, Thanksgiving will have come and gone. But as I write, the celebrations are still ahead. I'm thankful for the opportunity to pause and look to Christ in gratitude for the abundant grace He has poured out. It's a great time to reflect on the year and point to His mercies. I encourage you to do that.

I don't know about you, but this year was totally nuts at our house. We started the year off right: quarantined with COVID. (Ok, COVID wasn't fun, but the meals and groceries and notes and toys at our doorstep? That was fun. God really does care for our bodies and souls.)

About a month later, my grandfather died in our living room after a long battle with Parkinson's. Despite the sadness, I couldn't help but reflect on how God had provided this father figure to me so graciously. My Poppop, with his thick Puerto Rican accent and cheesy dad jokes, was always ready to rough-house when I was a kid or put too much chocolate syrup on my ice-cream when I, as a teen, sat at his table crying about some boy. He drove me wherever I needed to go, helped teach me how to drive, and then waited up for me as I spent more time away from home. I didn't deserve him, but how good is God for caring for me through him, and letting me be there in his final moments?

My chronic illness took a turn for the worse after these stressors, so I spent a lot of time with my doctors and specialists. My daughter, likewise, started to have lots of extra appointments. We both spent more time than we would have liked in the hospital this year. Once again, God chose to be so merciful to us: providing the most excellent care through doctors, therapists, surgeons, and even the elders of our church who always walked us through those times with love and prayer. Flowers, notes, meals... He did not have to pour out love to us that way, but He used those challenges to build us up and increase our trust in Him.

There were lots and lots of really *great* times this year, too! Buying a house, getting a promotion, starting an Etsy shop, watching friends be baptized, snuggling brand new babies, meeting goals, making new friends, having coffee every day!

No matter what God had for us this year, He used each and every circumstance for our good.

Our family is currently memorizing this timely Heidelberg Catechism question, Question 26: What do you believe when you say: I believe in God the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth?

Answer: That the eternal Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who out of nothing created heaven and earth and all that is in them and who still upholds and governs them by His eternal counsel and providence, is, for the sake of Christ His Son, my God and my Father. In Him I trust so completely as to have no doubt that He will provide me with all things necessary for body and soul, and will also turn to my good whatever adversity He sends me in this life of sorrow. He is able to do so as almighty God, and willing also as a faithful Father.

What a comfort we Christians possess, knowing that not only does the Maker of the universe have the power to use adversity for our good, but also cares enough about His children as a perfect and faithful Father that He wills our good. He uses all things to benefit us because He can and He wants to. What grace!

As you wrap up your year, no matter what it looked like, thank God. If heartache caused you to cry out to Him, thank Him for reminding you of His tender care. Thank Him for enduring that heartache when He lived a sinless life for you. Thank Him for being with you while you ache. Thank Him for the body of Christ that He uses to comfort us. Thank Him for the fruit of the Spirit He alone is producing in you. Thank Him for being on His throne.





Weather to Delay or Close?

In the event of a weather emergency, an e-mail will be sent by 8am if the schedule is modified.

For a Delay, the following schedule is typically used:

1st Period (Normally 8:40-9:40) --> 10:00-10:35 2nd Period (Normally 9:45-10:45 --> 10:40-11:15 3rd Period (Normally 10:50-11:50 --> 11:20-11:55

All afternoon classes are scheduled as normal. The first weather *closing* is not rescheduled. A second *closing* will be made up in May.

All meet for one hour for fifteen weeks **starting on January 13,2022** according to the preceding Spring Co-op schedule.



GYM CLASS - Still need some physical education credit? Meet for group exercises, games and sports outside on a large parking lot or in the gym during inclement weather. Instruction provided for students new to an activity.

GEOGRAPHY - A half-credit social studies class studying continents, countries, cultures and maps.





INTRO TO ENGINEERING - Learn about engineering as the practical application of scientific and mathematical knowledge for the betterment of humanity and the world. Specialties such as civil, geotechnical, agricultural, mechanical, industrial, electrical, petrochemical and more will be explored.

PHOTOGRAPHY - The primary focus is on composition, posing, and lighting plus basic photo editing. Access to a camera, internet, and the ability to upload images to a computer are necessary.


