

News from HSLDA & a CHALC Member Family

30 Minutes: All It Took to Prove This Homeschool Family Followed the Law

A veteran homeschooling family in Pennsylvania received a surprising start to their school year: a summons to court.

The family, who had homeschooled for more than two decades and are members of HSLDA, started the year as they had started every other: by filing their end-of-year evaluation for last school year, along with their homeschool affidavit and learning objectives for the new academic term.

School district officials acknowledged receipt of these documents, but said that the student's learning objectives were not complete because several subjects were missing. The mother explained that her son was a graduating senior who had already completed those subjects. Additionally, he was already 18, which meant he was no longer required by law to attend school.

The district responded by filing a complaint accusing the mother of violating Pennsylvania's compulsory school attendance statute. The complaint did not allege that the parents had failed to submit a homeschool affidavit or were not teaching their son. The sole issue was that the list of learning objectives for their 18-year-old son did not include enough subjects.

Making a Statement in Court

The family contacted Home School Legal Defense Association when they received the complaint—and a summons to court. At their trial, I argued that the family was innocent for three reasons.

First, there was no question that the family had filed everything required by Pennsylvania law. They filed their evaluation for the previous school year, which showed that the student had made adequate progress. They filed an affidavit for this school year, attesting that they would provide instruction in accordance with Pennsylvania law. And they filed their learning objectives for the subjects that the student would be taking this year—and the only subjects he had yet to complete before graduating from high school. The family fully complied with Pennsylvania law.

Second, it is true that Pennsylvania's homeschool statute requires parents to submit learning objectives, and also permits school districts to call a hearing when they reasonably believe a homeschool program is out of compliance with the statute. But the statute is also clear that a district cannot call a hearing based solely on the learning objectives—in fact, the statute explicitly says that "[t]he required outline of proposed education objectives shall not be utilized by the superintendent in determining if the home education program is out of compliance with this section." The district's objection—based solely on those objectives—was contrary to Pennsylvania law.

Finally, the homeschool statute creates a special procedure for addressing compliance issues. Rather than filing a complaint, the law requires districts to provide the family with written notice of any compliance problems. The family then has 30 days to respond. If they fail to do so, the district can call an administrative hearing before an impartial hearing officer, whose opinion can then be appealed to the commissioner of education. Only then can the matter be taken to a judge. Here, the family never received a 30-day notice letter, and no administrative hearing took place. In the absence of these steps, the district's complaint was also contrary to Pennsylvania law.

Clear Verdict

I cross-examined the assistant superintendent for about 20 minutes. I was able to show that the principal did not have a correct understanding of the law and had brought the case to court without legal grounds. Then I presented 10 minutes of argument explaining Pennsylvania's homeschool statute, after which the judge found the mother "not guilty."

It's unfortunate that a situation this minor was taken to court, but it is not uncommon. While homeschooling has become commonplace, there are still many—school officials, prosecutors, and judges—who are unfamiliar with their state's homeschool laws and the special protections that parents enjoy from both state statutes and the United States Constitution.

That is one of the core reasons why HSLDA exists. Whether driven by concerns about safety, the values of one's faith, a desire to invest in their children's education and maturity, or a combination of all the above, the decision to homeschool is important to so many families. And a decision that important deserves to be protected.

Advanced Art* Taking the Basics of Art to a new level of function and process to create art for portfolio use. Basic Art is a pre-requisite.

American History & Literature* American history text readings, class discussions, weekly assignments, related geography, quizzes and written assignments are combined with reading five American literature books.

American Literature* Starting with early American literature and progressing to current writings, students read unabridged works from an anthology and learn about literary concepts such as conflict, character, theme, structure, point of view, and moral tone. Includes writing and tests.

Anatomy & Physiology (Honors Level)*. Human Anatomy and Physiology analysis and synthesis with a focus on preparing for careers requiring knowledge of the human body.

Basic Art* Fundamental course teaching art appreciation, pencil control, the basic foundations of art, and the creative process. Pre-requisite for Advanced Art.

Bible Depicting + This course is designed to help students become better learners individually and in a group setting by depicting truths visually from the Bible.

Biblioplan Year 1 - Ancients* Covers ancient history from Creation to the Fall of Rome using the Biblioplan Year One curriculum.

Biblioplan Year 3 - Early Modern History*: Covers early modern U.S. and World History from 1600 to 1850 using the Biblioplan Year Three curriculum.

Biology*: Academic course covering all five kingdoms (Monera, Protista, fungi, plants and animals), Cytology, Genetics, Ecology, Creation vs evolution, and including some interactive labs.

Biology Lab: 12 weeks. Alternates dates with Environmental Science Lab. Designed to accompany without duplicating the labs in Biology class, this class is recommended but not required in conjunction with Biology, may be taken as a standalone supplement to learning or may complement a hometaught biology course. Chemistry* Academic chemistry class for students in 10th-12th grades and others with Algebra 1 skills. Includes labs to ensure students gain a firm understanding of chemistry.

Civics A half credit class using an American government textbook, class discussion, newspapers, other resources, and a mock trial to enhance study.

Creative Writing+ Read, critique, and compose original poetry, essay, short fiction, and creative non-fiction. Includes in-class timed writings and editing and revising of selected student writings.

Environmental Science*: Learn about and discuss current environmental topics and issues, stewardship of the earth and its resources, and the ecology of Pennsylvania.

Environmental Science Lab: 12 weeks. Alternates dates with Biology Lab. Designed to accompany without duplicating the labs in the Environmental Science class, this class is recommended but not required in conjunction with Environmental Science, may be taken as a stand-alone supplement to learning, or complement a home-taught science course. Taught by an experienced naturalist, the class is not graded. what science is and how to utilize the proper scientific method. Includes hands-on science experiments with household materials.

Geography +: A half credit course. Study each continent and a select group of countries in each using cultural studies and map work.

German 1A* A beginner level German course for high school students including textbook lessons, grammar, vocabulary and some German culture and history.

German 3* An intermediate level German course for high school students including textbook lessons, grammar, vocabulary and some German culture and history. German 2 or equivalent is a pre-requisite.

Gym Class+: A variety of outdoor and gym exercises, games and sports with instruction as needed to provide an hour of physical activity.

Health +: Covers maintaining health through exercise, diet and hygiene; safety; basic first aid; preventing diseases; avoiding drug abuse; and the variety of medical careers that exist.

Hebrew* Learn to read and write the letters, vowel markings, basic vocabulary and grammatical features of the Hebrew Language of the Old Testament with a goal of being able to read and translate short sentences or verses.

Institute for Excellence in Writing - Jr. High* The students will be exposed to systematic writing, grammar exercises, and reading vocabulary through the use of The Institute for Excellence in Writing's thematic unit series. Skills such as outlining, topic sentence and supporting details, taking notes, retelling, and peer editing are taught.

Intro to Architecture Introduction to the field of architecture including application of form and function to interior and exterior building design for a particular use on a certain piece of land. A design project is part of this class.

Introduction to Python+ This course will provide an introduction to the terms and concepts essential to the basic understanding and practice of computer programming in the PYTHON language through reading, weekly assignments and one or more programming projects.

Jane Austen's Life & Novels* This class focuses on the life of Jane Austen and an in-depth study of three of her novels and the ways she expressed her concerns and preoccupations with the changes that occurred in her era.

Life Science* This class offers a blend of lecture and lab in order to prepare students for a future biology class. Students learn about cells, energy for plants and animals, DNA, and an overview of organisms from bacteria to humans.

Master of Defense Study the history, politics and technology of Medieval and Renaissance swordsmanship and learn to use fencing sabers.

Mechanical Drawing + An introduction to mechanical drawing through instruction in the concepts, tools, and practices used to understand, interpret, and prepare mechanical drawings, including multi-view and isometric approaches. Hand drafting skills will be emphasized, but the class may also include an introduction to computer applications available for little or no

MUS Algebra One* Academic course of foundational Algebra 1, the cornerstone of secondary math.

MUS Algebra Two* Academic course building on a solid foundation of Pre-algebra and Algebra 1.

MUS Geometry* Academic geometry topics plus the development of critical thinking skills using a variety of logical problems, both of geometric and algebraic perspectives. Technology, manipulatives, and discovery learning are used.

MUS Pre-Algebra* Academic course considered the foundation for all subsequent math.success.

MUS Pre-Calculus* Covers the key mathematical concepts needed to prepare for calculus. Pre-requisites for this course are Algebra II and Geometry with a minimum C grade.

Music Appreciation + This class is a general music class aimed toward but not exclusive to 7th-9th grades. Students will study musical elements and music history as well as learn how to listen intelligently to music among other topics.

PSAT/SAT Math Prep: 4 weeks. Sep 1, 8, 15, 22 PSAT/SAT Mathematics Prep Class will prepare students to perform at a higher level on the SAT and the PSAT by using strategies to solve problems and by reviewing specific examples of problems found on the PSAT.

circular motion, work and energy, momentum, periodic motion, waves and optics, electricity, and magnetism. Pre-requisites are Algebra 1 and Geometry.

Psychology* This course will discuss the history of the science of psychology and move to the different psychological approaches and then the different branches of applied psychology. Lessons will cover different disorders and the maintenance of personal optimal mental health.

Research Writing +: This course covers several of the forms used for research papers for different types of classes/disciplines, including MLA, APA, CMOS,IEEE, and AMA. Finding acceptable resources, writing, proper citation, making annotated bibliographies, and learning techniques to stay organized and efficient when writing a research paper will be covered.

Sewing : Learn to sew or improve sewing skills by getting to know the basics, completing simple pattern projects, and advancing to designing and completing increasingly complex projects.

Spanish – Introductory* A non-grammar-based class focusing on simple conversational French by learning vocabulary, common phrases, and pronunciation to prepare students for Spanish! or supplementing those studying Spanish on their own using a computer program and needing speaking practice.

Spanish 1A* The first half of a 2-part full high school level Spanish 1 course.

Spanish 1B*: The second half of a 2-part full high school level Spanish 1 course. Completion of Spanish 1A or equivalent is a pre-requisite.

Spanish 2* A full high-school level Spanish 2 course including a grammar-based workbook series that interweaves listening and speaking practice by native Spanish speakers.

Spanish 3*: Continues from where Spanish 2 left off and puts what has been learned to use with more reading, writing and speaking opportunities.

Theatre Basics + Learn about the origins and purpose of theatre and its historical and cultural impact. Activities include character study, monologue, story development, group writing, improv games, reading a play together, and classroom presentations.

Vocal Ensemble* Learning to sing as a group, mostly a capella. Breathing, diction, music notation and reading skills, and other general choral skills will be taught.

Did you know, last June, Pennsylvania passed House Bill 1615, which changes the compulsory school age from ages 8-17 to ages 6-18? Beginning in the 2020/2021 school year, homeschool parents will need to provide an affidavit, compile a portfolio, and have an evaluation done for any child 6 years or older. At MACH we provide academic classes for all ages. Our classes are on a scheduled rotational basis, so you know your child will receive all the necessary training in science, history, physical education, and in the secondary grades, English Writing & Literature. Co-op classes provide this necessary teaching, as well as provide worksheets, projects, etc. to include in the homeschool portfolio.

- Receive teaching of history from K- 6th grade, with a 4th grade emphasis on PA History.
- Are taught all areas of science, with class time dedicated to lab work, "hands-on-activities", and special in-depth unit studies.
- Participate in year-long gym classes, and are instructed in a variety of group sports, learning teamwork, listening skills, coordination, and agility. At-home physical fitness is also encouraged. Log sheets and tests are optional but make great additions to the homeschool portfolio.
- In addition to the morning classes of history, science, and gym, students may choose to participate in afternoon electives such as art, life skills, Lego club, music, and drama.

Junior and Senior High Students:

- Students completing our regular rotation of morning courses, will receive all the credits needed to fulfill the homeschool law in the area of Science, English, and Social Studies.
- Areas of science which are taught: Earth Science, Life Science, Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, and Anatomy & Physiology
- Social Studies rotation includes: Early American History, Renaissance & Reformation, World Geography, Modern World History with World Religions, Personal Finance (economics), Government/Civics, and Psychology.
- Our English rotation includes a strong writing component in the junior high years, including instruction in writing a research paper. Grade appropriate novels are read and analyzed. Students will also learn speech skills and give oral presentation. High school students rotate through the following three courses: English with an American Literature emphasis, English with a British Literature emphasis, and English with a World Literature Emphasis. High schoolers will continue to sharpen their written communication skills, as well as their oral communication skills through both individual and group presentations.
- Students may participate in additional afternoon electives, such as art, debate, volleyball, and music/drama. Math classes are also available at this level.

What does this mean for you as a parent?

 Having a continuous rotation of classes gives parents the assurance their student is receiving all the teaching and instruction needed to fulfill the homeschool law. It helps eliminate the guess-work and stress of wondering if your child is learning all they need to know!






