
Offering Programs Just for Homeschoolers!



that I knew about. But that didn't stop him. He paged through the magazine asking me if I ever heard of this game or that game...and I said, "No." and he would laugh.....Until he turned the page and the title of the article in big white letters was "Exodus".

He said, "Hey, Nana, do you know anything about Exodus?"

"Oh...yes...," I said, "I know about the book of Exodus. Do you know the story about the Israelites and how they were set free from slavery?" He shook his head no....and so.... we were off.

I love to tell stories and make people laugh. So there we sat for at least a half an hour. As I told him from memory the story of Joseph and Moses and how God saved His people from the Angel of Death and how God delivered His people from Pharaoh and how the Israelites needed the blood of the spotless lamb to be saved from the Angel of Death, so do we need the blood from the spotless Lamb of God, Jesus. 



10th - 12th Grade Options:

Introduction to Law - Subjects covered will include the nature and evolution of law, the American Legal System, constitutional law emphasizing the freedom of religion provisions, criminal and tort law, and contract law. The class will develop an appreciation for law, a basic knowledge of our rights, and perhaps, an interest in a career in law.

High School Biology (Grades 10 – 12) - Exploring Creation with Biology is a college-prep biology course that provides a detailed introduction to the methods and concepts of general biology. With a strong emphasis on the vocabulary of biology, the course provides the student with a strong background in the scientific method, the five-kingdom classification scheme, microscopy, biochemistry, cellular biology, molecular and Mendelian genetics, evolution, dissection, and ecosystems. The student needs the Apologia Biology textbook 2nd edition, and although tests will not be given in class, students are encouraged to purchase the solutions manual for the textbook, which includes tests and an answer key for the tests.

High School English Class (Grades 10-12) - Student will be required to submit a written book report on a non-class book at the end of each quarter. In addition, we will be making use of The Write Source for the "technical" side of English, plus building our vocabularies. Students will also learn how to do a Power Point presentation. Literature will include: Arthur Miller, The Crucible; Harper Lee, To Kill a Mockingbird; Mark Twain, The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn; John Steinbeck, The Grapes of Wrath or another 20th century American Novel; SHAKESPEAREAN TRAGEDY: Romeo and Juliet.

Modern World History (Grades 10-12) - A Biblical worldview will be emphasized as students view modern history and global issues. A background of world religions, and the social condition of the time, will provide a basis for our analysis of history. Students will be encouraged to discuss and debate unresolved problems of the modern world. The modern mission movement will also be introduced and studied in this course.

Texts: Modern World History, Patterns of Interaction, 2005 edition, (ISBN 978-0-61837711-4, less than \$10), Bible, The Compact Guide to World Religions (ISBN 1 – 55661 – 704 – 6), Book of choice from list of 19th and 20th century missionaries.


